As the church of St. Peter at Arches is also at Lincoln, the whole connexion of Rawlinson G 168 is with Lincoln rather than with Worcester, and it has no claim to be called (as in Floyer and Hamilton s Worcester Catalogue, p. 168) a Worcester book. And also in Jerome s original arrangement the parallel section-numbers in the other Gospels: by this means it was possible to compare the parallel matter of two or more Gospels without the trouble of referring to the table at the beginning of the MS. Besides the letter of Jerome to Damasus, and the spurious commentary on St. Mark, Senatus drew also on the genuine Commzntarii in Mattheum, for these are the source of the allusion in lines 53 ff. to Julian s attack on the discrepancy of the two...
