Most of the empirical research has focused on the innovation process and on managerial or organizational approaches as well as performance measures for individual projects (Imai et al., 1985; Henderson, 1990; Clark and Fujimoto, 1991; Cusumano, 1991). At the same time, there are various reports that leading Japanese manufacturers tend to develop new products much more frequently than U.S. or European competitors and that this has been one of the major reasons, along with manufacturing skills, for their strong growth performance in global markets (Abegglen and Stalk, 1985; Dertouzos et al., 1988; Womack et al., 1990).
